Access could be provided by a remote access device (e.g., mobile broadband hotspot devices like Rocket Sticks, MiFis and Rocket Hubs, etc) that allows students to work remotely. How many times in the last month have you had to rely on emergency unqualified individuals due to a shortage of casual staff for non-teaching positions?	<ul> <li>"Unqualified individuals" in this instance are individuals who are 18 years of age or older, employed in a non-teaching position in an emergency situation.</li> <li>In establishing the "number of times", each instance in one day should be considered as one.
